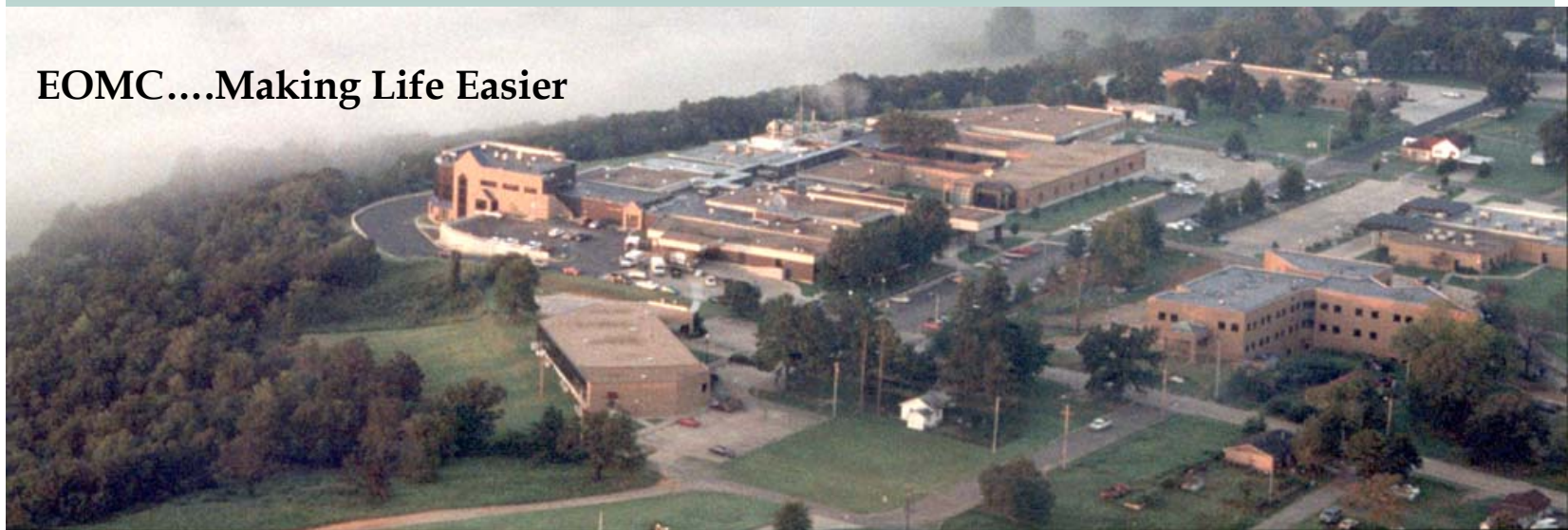

Community Benefits?

EOMC is the community hospital. We provide a full range of medical services to the community. Our goal is to efficiently provide comprehensive personal healthcare services by making available modern medical equipment, specialized medical services, and medical knowledge which would be limited without proper facilities.

EOMC provides a variety of health care programs, education, and services at little or no cost. This also includes assuming financial responsibility for providing charity care and serving citizens who are unable to pay all of the expenses related to their care.

Hospital Auxiliary \$5,000

In addition to working as a hospital volunteer, Eastern Oklahoma Medical Center's sixty member Auxiliary provides college scholarships to employees or employees family members to assist in the completion of their education. In 2009, the auxiliary awarded five

Radiology Program \$81,500

Recognizing the need for radiology technologists EOMC partnered with Carl Albert State College to create the CASC radiology program. The program is located in the hospital and graduates 8 radiology technologist students per year. EOMC has been recognized by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education for the partnership with CASC.

Charity Care \$158,000

Eastern Oklahoma Medical Center serves the community by providing medical care to all patients regardless of their ability to pay. Financial assistance is available to the uninsured or underinsured who qualify. In 2009, approximately \$158,000 thousand dollars

Community Support

Eastern Oklahoma Medical Center participates in and sponsors numerous community events. The hospital provides meeting space to a variety of non-profit community clubs, translation services for non English speaking patients, hosts blood drives, provides meals for the underprivileged, and is a corporate sponsor of the March of Dimes and other charities.



Over 100 employees volunteered for the annual trash off hosted by the Poteau Chamber of Commerce. EOMC is the recipient of the 2008 and 2009 first place awards for the most trash picked up and the most participants.

Uncompensated Care \$4,800,000

Eastern Oklahoma Medical Center delivered services to our citizens who found themselves in personal situations that did not allow them to meet their healthcare financial obligations and also provided care that was only partially funded by federal, state and local programs, such as Medicaid and Medicare. In 2009, it cost EOMC approximately \$4.8 million dollars to provide services to our patients who had little or no ability to pay.

AHEC \$ 18,550

Eastern Oklahoma Medical Center supports the Area Health Education Center by providing housing, meals, training site, and computer services for future doctors and physician assistants. This program is important to the process of developing doctors and physician assistants to help ensure an adequate supply to meet ongoing community

Eastern Oklahoma Medical Center is a licensed 84-bed healthcare provider that serves LeFlore and the surrounding counties with a total population of approximately 48,000. EOMC has been serving the needs of this community for over 59 years by combining the personal touch of a community hospital with state of the art technology. We provide a full range of medical services to the community. Since 1950, EOMC has worked to provide quality healthcare throughout Southeastern Oklahoma. EOMC is a public non-profit entity overseen by a Board of Trustees appointed by the LeFlore County Commissioners.
