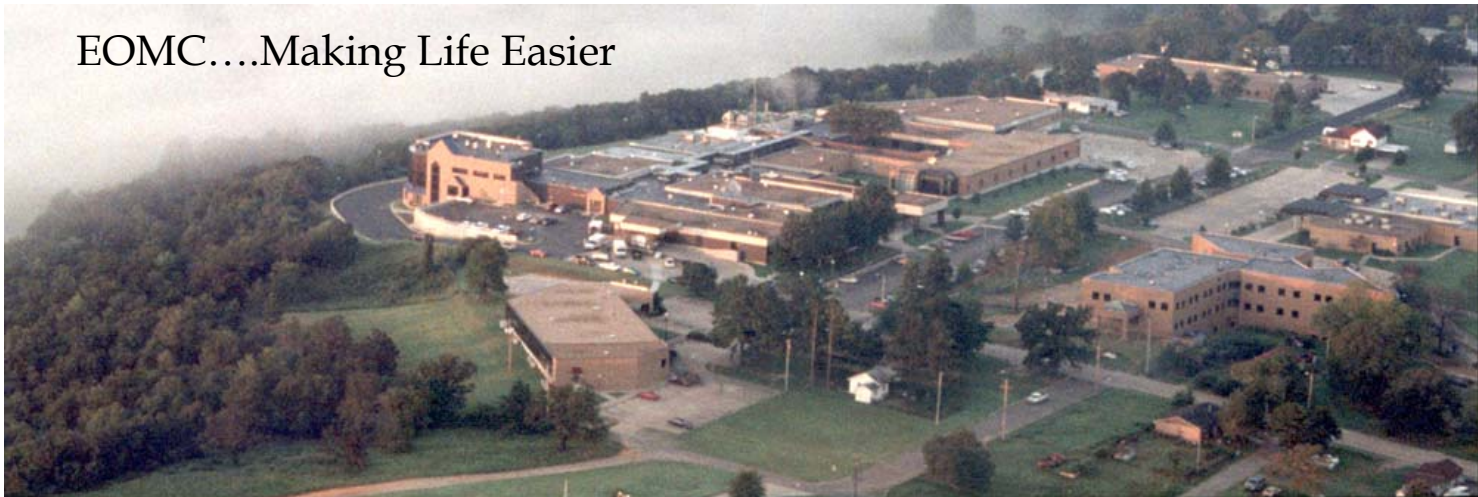

Benefits of direct deposit for your payroll check:
